She has earned many awards for her singing, including the George Woodhead Prize in Voice from the Peabody Conservatory, the Award for Excellence in the Arts from the National Society of Arts and Letters, and The Washington Post Music and Dance Scholarship Award. Ms. Ferrara is a frequent artist with the IN Series opera company in Washington, D.C. and performs with a number of other local groups including Maryland Lyric Opera, Washington Master Chorale, Georgetown Chorale, and the Sam Bonds Chorale—a new choral ensemble for which she also serves as President.

A graduate of the Master of Music program at the Peabody Conservatory, she plans to continue to pursue musical endeavors that stretch the norms of classical music and seek to educate and serve the community.
